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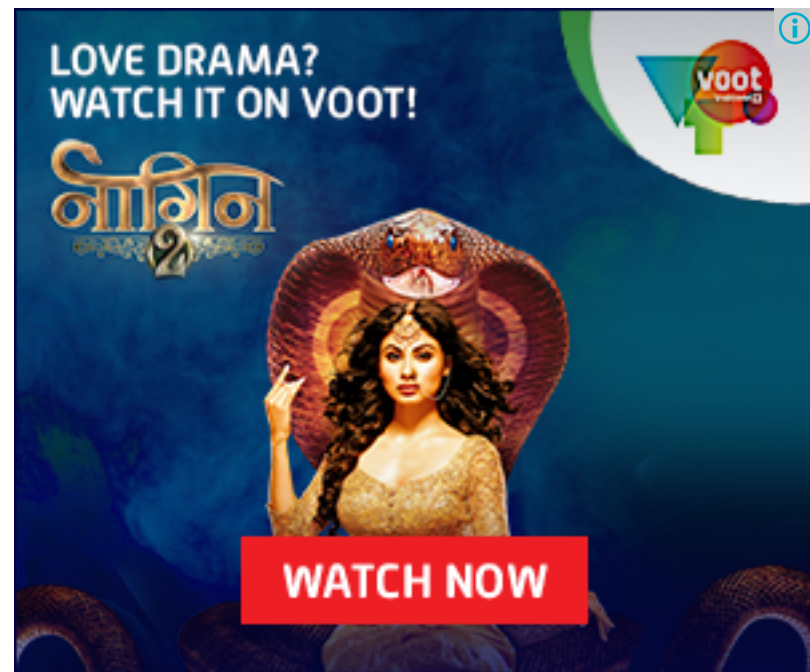
Suspend licence of six docs: MCI

Medical Council of India (MCI) recommended licence suspension of seven city doctors for a year. While six of them are from ILS Hospitals in Dum Dum, another is from Maniktala's ESI Hospital accused for medical negligence causing death of two patients. The council approved removal of their names for a year from Indian Medical Register.

The petition had been filed with the MCI by Ranjit Sarkar, father of a Jadavpur University PhD scholar Indrajit (36) who had died at ILS Hospital on 12 July, 2014 after falling from the stairs. Sarkar had initially moved the state medical council but he didn't hear back for six months.

An ILS spokesperson said it was a merely a recommendation by MCI. "There is no specific directive till now. We will continue to employ these doctors. We hope the state medical council will be just



to us.” However, Sarkar said if the license of these doctors are not removed immediately, he will move the court.

Meanwhile, MCI also directed removal of doctor D N Dutta's name from IMR for a year, as he had refused the admission of a heart patient to ICU, when she had chest pain and low blood pressure.
